**January 18, 2019** 

On December 24, 2018, at approximately 11:00 p.m., three suspects forced entry into a residence in the 300 block of South Haley Street. The suspects brandished a firearm at the elderly resident and demanded currency. During the robbery, the suspects assaulted and tortured the victim over the course of several hours. After obtaining several items of value, the suspects fled the residence. The suspects were described as:

- 1) Black Male Adult, wearing a mask and a grey hooded sweatshirt
- 2) Black Male Adult, slim build
- 3) Black Male Adult, slim build

Investigators learned that one of the items taken during the robbery was the victim's bank card. Several hours later, two subjects attempted to utilize the victim's stolen bank card at businesses in the Rosedale Highway corridor. It is unknown at this time if these subjects are involved in the home invasion robbery.

The Bakersfield Police Department is asking for the community's assistance in identifying the two depicted subjects who are wanted for questioning regarding the violent home invasion robbery and the unlawful use of a stolen bank card. These subjects are described as:

- 1. White Female Adult, 30-40 years old, Light Brown Hair, wearing a dark colored jacket, black pants
- 2. White Male Adult, 30-40 years old, wearing a blue baseball cap, a dark colored jacket, blue denim pants
